1. Hotel assignments

We have set record attendance again for the SLC; this will be our largest conference in our 60 year history! We have worked out a great plan with the hotel to handle the number of attendees that we have for the conference itself and we will share those details closer to the conference.

For the hotel sleeping rooms, however, we have exceeded the number of rooms that The Hunt Valley Inn has. While we have secured every room The Hunt Valley Inn physically has, we will still need to use approximately 50 rooms at Embassy Suites across the street from The Hunt Valley Inn.

We will have a continuous bus shuttle service between The Hunt Valley Inn and Embassy Suites and it shouldn't take more than 5-7 minutes to get from one hotel to the other. The hotels are across the street from each other but you cannot cross the street on foot as it is a three lane divided highway with a concrete barrier in the middle. The bus shuttle service will ensure a safe and efficient transfer of our students and advisors between the properties.

I am soliciting chapters who would like to volunteer to be housed at Embassy Suites. If your chapter would like to volunteer to be housed at Embassy Suites, please e-mail David Jones (davejones21122@yahoo.com) by 5 p.m. this Thursday, March 24. If we do not get enough volunteers, we will assign chapters to stay at Embassy Suites. Some things to keep in mind about Embassy Suites:
