1. Who is Eligible to compete at the State Leadership Conference?

Some events are offered at the state level only and others required students to have qualified at the regional conference. To determine if an event is a state level only event or required qualification at the regional conference, review grid on page 8-10 of the Maryland Competitive Events Handbook that is posted on the Maryland FBLA website at:

In addition, the **Board of Directors has created a “Competitive Events Made Easy” summary sheet** of all competitive events offered at the SLC. This summary sheet is included on pages 138-152 of the Maryland Competitive Events Handbook. It is also attached to this e-mail for your convenience. The summary sheet lists who is eligible to compete and what type of competition is held at the SLC. Please review the summary sheet in conjunction with the Maryland Competitive Events Handbook for detailed event guidelines and requirements.

If you have a student that is eligible to compete at the SLC but is not able to attend, you may **NOT substitute a replacement for this student.**

For events with an objective test only component or objective test events with a performance component that allow five students from each region to compete at the SLC, students placing 6th or below in these events are NOT eligible to compete at the SLC if a student in 1st to 5th place cannot attend.

For production test events that allow three students from each region to compete at the SLC, students placing 4th or below in these events are NOT eligible to compete at the SLC if a student in 1st to 3rd place cannot attend.

For performance only events that allow three students from each region to compete at the SLC, the opportunity to compete may be extended to the student who placed 4th and 5th at regionals if either the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place student are not able to attend the SLC. Students placing 6th or below in these events are NOT eligible to compete at the SLC. These are performance only events. See a complete listing below.

If you have a student in one of the following events that placed 1st, 2nd, or 3rd at regionals and is NOT attending the SLC, you must notify Jason Kahler at jason.kahler@maryland.gov no later than **February 22, 2019** and the opportunity to compete will be given to the next student on the list of winners from the regional conference.

This will be strictly enforced and all students registered for competitive events will be cross-checked against the winners list from the regional conferences. Please notify Jason as soon as you know the student will not be participating in the competitive event at the SLC but no later than **February 22, 2019**. The more notice we have the better chance that another student will be able to fill the slot. We would like to offer the opportunity to compete to as many students as possible and by giving adequate notice of a student who is unable to compete, you will help us to do that.

Members not having paid their dues by February 27, 2019 will not be allowed to compete or attend the SLC. Please do not allow this to happen to your members. Please check with National FBLA to make sure that they have your correct listing of members. It is very easy to miss a name when National downloads them. Some of you think you have active chapters but you do not. The National Office verifies all entries in events and if they don't have you registered, you will not be able to participate in the conference. Your chapter will not be allowed to register for the State Leadership Conference until you pay dues for all chapter members.

2. Written report and other pre-judged materials deadline and submission instructions

All written reports and other pre-judged materials **must be RECEIVED** by the Competitive Events Committee by **February 22, 2019 at 5 p.m.** All reports and other pre-judged materials will be submitted online instead of by mail. Complete the required information on the online form and upload a PDF of the report/pre-judged material for the events listed below using the addresses listed.

REMINDER: Prejudged component for the following events:

Future Business Leader– Resume and letter of application submitted electronically in advance of SLC, competitors bring one (1) hard copy of resume and letter of application to the interview at the SLC.

Job Interview– Resume and letter of application now submitted electronically in advance of SLC, competitors bring one (1) hard copy of resume and letter of application to the interview at the SLC.

3. Online testing for objective tests for SLC

Objective test for all events that have an objective test component will be administered online at the home school in advance of the SLC. The same testing system used for regional conference online testing will be used for SLC online testing. Students will no longer take the objective (written) test on Scantrons at the SLC. The online testing window for the SLC is:

- **SLC Online Testing Open:** March 4, 2019
- **SLC Online Testing Closes:** March 22, 2019

For events with an objective test and a performance component, all individuals or teams will take the objective test online at their home school. The top ten individuals or teams (depending on the event) with the highest objective test score will advance to the performance round. The top ten individuals or teams will be announced onsite at the SLC. There is not enough time or resources from when the testing window closes until when the SLC begins for the Competitive Events Committee to summarize the results and release the top ten in each event prior to the SLC.

Jason Kahler from MSDE will e-mail chapters the online testing log in instructions prior to March 4, 2019.

4. Production Test procedures–uploaded online

After registration closes on February 27, 2019 the Maryland State Department of Education will e-mail instructions for events that have a production test component that must be completed prior to the SLC. This includes the following events:

The production skills portion of the event will be taken in the home school prior to the conference and uploaded to the Wufoo site by **March 18, 2019 by 5 p.m.** This is PRIOR to the SLC. If you have a student in any of these events, please get computer time and a proctor scheduled now so that you don't run into a problem as this is a quick turnaround.

Similar to last year, the testing materials will be sent to you electronically and the student will save their completed work product(s) electronically and this will be uploaded to the Wufoo site. Links to the Wufoo site for uploading can be found in the appendix of the Maryland FBLA Competitive Events Guide and instructions will be sent with the testing materials. 5. Competitive events offered at SLC that do NOT require pre-qualification at the regional conference

For those students who did not compete at regionals or competed at regionals but did not qualify for the State Leadership Conference, there are several events that are offered at the state conference that do not require pre-qualification in order to compete at the SLC. In other words, students may register for the following events without having competed at regionals. Even if the student competed in a different event at regionals and didn't qualify for the SLC, they may compete in one of the following events at the SLC:

6. Open Events

Six open events will be offered at the 2019 State Leadership Conference. Any student participating in the SLC is eligible to participate in Open Events with no limitations per chapter or per event. The Open Events will be offered in three sessions throughout the conference, with two tests being offered each session. A student may take one test in each session based on space availability.

There is no prequalification for these events and three awards will be issued for each Open Event. Preregistration for Open Events will no longer be required or offered. The events will be offered at select times throughout the conference and will be offered on a first come, first serve basis. Once all seats are filled for each event on site, the event will be closed. Open Events will be administered using Scantrons onsite at the conference.

7. Competitive events schedule

As was noted in the Advisor Update #4, some competitive events will begin at Noon on Thursday, March 28. As more details are known about what specific events will occur on Thursday, the information will be distributed to all chapters. For planning purposes, please make sure you plan to arrive at the hotel as close to 10 a.m. (conference registration start time) as possible to make sure your students are there in time for the competitive events. Any student who is not present for their competitive event will be disqualified from competition. Please allow adequate time for travel.

8. Middle Level Competitive Events

National FBLA has established a new Middle Level Competitive Events Program for the 2018-19 academic year. Maryland FBLA will follow all guidelines and policies as established by the National Office with state regulations as listed in the Competitive Events Handbook.
