Maryland FBLA and March Of Dimes Signature Chef's Gala Event

Your Maryland FBLA State Officer team volunteered at the Maryland March of Dimes' Signature Chefs event at the Baltimore Waterfront Marriott on October 28, 2008. The Signature Chefs event was held by the March of Dimes to raise money to improve the health of babies by preventing birth defects, premature birth, and infant mortality.

The Signature Chefs event began with a VIP reception with Rahman "Rock" Harper (Chef Rock), the winner of Season 3 of Hell's Kitchen. The rest of the evening included tasting stations featuring many top chefs from the Baltimore area, a silent auction, and a live auction. The event was very successful with over 500 guests in attendance and over \$155,000 raised. Your Maryland FBLA state officers played an important role in the success of the event. The officers greeted guests as they arrived and were in charge of the silent auction. The silent auction consisted of over 100 items and required the officers to monitor the items and bid sheets during the auction, move the items after bidding had been closed, and distribute the items once winners were ready to pick them up.
