CTSO State Officer Training

This past August, the Maryland State Officer Team, alongside three other Career and Technology Student Organizations (CTSO) including DECA, SkillsUSA, and FFA, attended CTSO Officer Training, run by the Maryland State Department of Education. Over the span of two intensive days of networking and fun, the respective state officers were given a chance to collaborate and learn how to lead in the upcoming school year.

On the first day, the state officers attended informative workshops on a variety of leadership topics, including public speaking, parliamentary procedure, fundraising and recruitment. In addition, the officers had the opportunity to pose questions to a panel of past state officers to get a better feel of the challenges that they would face during their term.

At night, the Maryland State Officer team participated in a team bonding session at the local SkyZone. However, the day was far from over for the state officers. After the team bonding session, it was Program of Work time. To better plan their goals and methods of execution, the officer team laid out a detailed plan of the benchmarks they wanted to reach and how they would reach them, thus creating the Program of Work for 2016-2017, a clear, and concise way to stay organized. The first workshop of the day centered around the creation of public service announcements by each CTSO to announce their respective fall leadership conference. The Maryland FBLA State Officers had perfected the Program of Work, and presented their plan of action to the rest of the CTSOs with one goal in mind: take Maryland FBLA to new heights!

By the end of the second day, each CTSO state officer team had gone through an intense marathon of workshops, leadership development, and planning to prepare for the upcoming school year. Yet, who could forget all the wonderful memories of inter-CTSO peer networking, an opportunity to create lifelong relationships for the years to come. As bags were being packed, and goodbyes being said, the Maryland state officers knew that they now were equipped with valuable skills to leave their own Legacy of Leadership during the upcoming year.

Recruitment Tips

Use these tips compiled by your State Officers to grow your chapter to new Heights!

- Encourage members from your local chapter to create a brief and interactive presentation on FBLA. Present to different classes during the beginning of the school year to inform students about the opportunities FBLA provides.
- Reach out to a middle school(s) nearby and start a middle level chapter! Getting middle school students involved in FBLA increases their likelihood of joining FBLA once they enroll in high school.
- 3. Set up an information table at your school's Open House Night to not only inform students, but also to inform parents about

- the benefits of joining FBLA. (Include brochures, flyers, sign-up sheet etc.)
- 4. Host a "Bring a Friend" meeting for your local chapter to get non-members interested in FBLA. Every member must bring a friend and members who bring the most friends can be offered an incentive, such as a reduction in dues.
- Create a school-wide, eye-catching bulletin board detailing your chapter's accomplishments. Update bi-weekly and include information and success stories from local chapter events, SLC, NFLC, NLC, etc.

Individual Objective Tests

A 60-minute test administered during the Regional, State, and National Leadership Conferences. Non-Graphing calculators are provided for all objective tests. These tests will be completed before the Regional Leadership Conferences during the Online Testing window. The administration of these tests is the local chapter's responsibility.

Performance Events

Team Role Play

Competitors receive a role play scenario 10 or 20 minutes prior to their scheduled event times. Judges receive a copy of the role play along with suggested questions to ask during each performance.

Individual, Team, or Chapter Prejudged

Report or project content is prejudged before the conference. The presentation of a report or project is judged during the conference.

Performance Events (cont.)

Individual Interview

The employer (judge) interviews the applicant (competitor) by asking typical job interview questions.

Individual Speech

A business speech based on FBLA-PBL goals, current events, and/or relevant business topics created and articulated by competitors.

Individual or Team Presentation

The presentation of an individual or team's project, or campaign on a specific topic provided in the event guidelines. This topic changes each year.

This award meets one of the required criteria for the <u>Leader</u> level of the <u>Business Achievement Awards</u> and the <u>FBLA Outstanding</u> <u>Chapter Recognition Award</u>. **Deadline: April 1**. <u>Apply</u>.

Membership Mania

FBLA members who recruit at least ten (10) new members receive a certificate of recognition and are recognized on the national website. Local chapter advisers are encouraged to present this award to winning members at a local FBLA ceremony, meeting, event, or school awards assembly. This award meets one of the criteria for the America level of the Business Achievement Awards. Deadline: April 1. Apply.

Business Achievement Awards (BAA)

The FBLA <u>Business Achievement Awards (BAA)</u> is an intensive leadership development program that recognizes FBLA members for achievements in a variety of career-related projects, goals, and programs. High school students create a portfolio of real-world accomplishments and develop their business and leadership skills across four levels: <u>Future</u>, <u>Business</u>, <u>Leader</u>, and <u>America</u>.

Community Service Awards

The <u>Community Service Awards</u> (CSA) recognize members with extraordinary commitment to community service. It has three levels: CSA Community (50 hours), CSA Service (200 hours), and CSA Achievement (500 hours).
