Welcome back MDFBLA! The State Officer Team and Board of Directors is extremely excited for the new membership year. MDFBLA would like to provide students and chapters with information regarding Chapter Recruitment, the Early Bird Challenge, and Edition.

As the new membership year gets started, MDFBLA wants to provide recruitment ideas to aid in growing your chapter with new and committed members. First, your chapter should send informational packets to all students enrolled in Business and CTE classes. My chapter's membership increased by 75% the year



following the distribution of the packets; thus an excellent way to recruit new members. Another effective membership recruitment idea is to create a bulletin board and promotional flyers to market FBLA which should be placed in high traffic locations at your school in order to gain the most attention possible. Lastly, a fantastic membership recruitment idea is to have strong social media presence. Online mediums are a fantastic way to reach prospective members, and can allow your chapter to stand out from other school organizations and opportunities. These ideas, if well executed, can have a large impact on your chapter's membership growth.

One of MDFBLA's new programs for the 2018-2019 Year is the Early Bird Challenge. Any chapter that has 5 or more dues paid members to National FBLA by October 20, will be recognized with ribbons at the State Leadership Conference. Participation and completion of the Early Bird Challenge is a required activity for the Gold Seal Chapter Award. Another Chapter Award is the National FBLA Super Sweeps which requires chapters to complete several tasks centered around FBLA recruitment. All members of the chapters who attend the National Leadership Conference, will be given ribbons for recognition.

CTSO TRAINING RECAP



Maryland FBLA's State Officer Team (SOT) gathered at the Turf Valley Resort for the 2018 Career Technology Student Organization (CTSO) Joint Officer Training, sponsored by MSDE, launching another exciting year for the organization. State Officer Teams from across Maryland, attended a two-day training to learn more about their officer duties and expectations. The MDFBLA State Officers gained insights on the unique aspects of each CTSO (DECA, SkillsUSA, and FFA), while also discovering the similarities of the other organizations. As Patty Hendrickson, former FBLA National President and world-renowned motivational speaker, stated, "The organizations all fall under the same CTSO umbrella supported by the co-curricular handle." In other words, with terms such as "leadership," "education," and "career" repeating in CTSO mission statements, the organizations share a common goal: to prepare high school students for the future. Over the two days, Ms. Hendrickson led training sessions using interactive and engaging activities, in which the MDFBLA SOT learned effective team-building strategies and ways to serve the organization's members. Most memorably, Ms. Hendrickson shared her Starter-Kit tips which the SOT will definitely practice at our upcoming State Fall Leadership Conference

FBLA offers more opportunities for members to highlight their skillsets than just competing in competitive events. The Business Achievement Awards and Community Service Awards are two of these opportunities.

First, the BAA focuses on classroom education and developing students as leaders inside and outside of their school - BAAs are based on three key concepts of Service, Education, and Progress. The BAA program has four different levels of achievement - Future, Business, Leader, and America - all of which have material requisites of increasing difficulty. These requisites vary greatly but include learning more about FBLA in multiple ways, practicing business skills and operations, promoting you chapter and FBLA, and many other valuable exercises. These are due on March 1st to National FBLA, and, as part of the MDFBLA Rockstar program, any chapter who has at least 15% of their members complete any level of the Business Achievement Awards, by February 22, will receive a ribbon at the SLC!

Next, the CSA program is a crucial part of FBLA, not only by improving oneself but also improving their community and the lives of others for the better. In this spirit, the FBLA Pay It Forward Challenge recognizes and rewards members with an extraordinary commitment to community service. The CSA program has three levels/tiers: CSA Community (50 hours), CSA Service (200 hours), and CSA Achievement (500 hours). Also, hours for the CSA are cumulative and build throughout a student's FBLA career! For MDFBLA, these hours must be submitted by February 22nd, and, for recognition by National FBLA, the hours must be submitted by March 1st.
